Local Solutions' mission to help young adults with disabilities build independent lives in their community is blossoming right in the heart of Bar Harbor! St. Saviour's Church has generously donated their Parish House to renovate into apartments and shared living space. Local Solutions has partnered with Community Housing of Maine (CHOM), a Portland based non-profit experienced in creating homes and inclusive communities. We began operating under the Charlotte White Center. On July 1, 2014 we became our own non-profit.

Our project is now supported by a group of determined parents— and amazing young people ready and waiting to

move in! Our future residents will get to work, learn, have fun, and volunteer in their community. They will have support staff, as well as the natural support of family, and community members

championing their efforts—and cheering them on.

WHO WE ARE

MDI's new nonprofit Local Solutions epitomizes an optimistic story.

THE PROBLEM: Every year children with disabilities, who have been supported through school, graduate and have nowhere to go. In many cases, their social, emotional, and financial support vanishes. State and federally funded group homes are not available for everyone. Among these vulnerable citizens, many continue to live with their parents which is not a long term solution.



Young adults and their parents need to create their own lives and relationships.

OUR RESPONSE: In 2010 a group of local parents gathered to address the problem of ensuring a stable, long-term housing solution for our adult children where they will live with support, as independently as possible.

OUR DREAM: To create a model intentional community, built on partnerships and community values, that can be replicated in other towns near and far. We believe that life-long planning for post-schoolage adults with disabilities should be an integral part of a healthy community's housing plan and opportunities.

GOOD NEWS — SOME SPECIAL GRANTS

Morris W. Stroud III had in mind when the fund was created in 1990. We are very grateful for this generous donation towards the renovation of the St. Saviour's Parish House.

Local Solutions has been the recipient of a \$10,000 grant from the Stroud Fund, an outreach fund administered by The Stroud Committee of the Parish of St. Mary and St. Jude in Northeast and Seal Harbor respectively. The committee felt our The Parish House project at St. Saviour's Episcopal Church which will benefit our whole island community closely matched the mission that Dr.

In April, Maine Governor Paul LePage gave Local Solutions \$30,000 from his contingency fund to help with the renovations of St. Saviour's Parish House.

Dee Karnofsky and Lee Haynes met with Governor LePage and staff of the D.H.H.S. and Community Housing of Maine to discuss our plans and to ask for their support. We are honored that Governor LePage responded with this donation. He commented, "The Parish House will provide a safe environment in which these adults will enjoy independence, the ability to care for themselves and for others."

We are reaching for a goal of \$1.3 million to fund renovations of the Parish House.

Cost of renovating the Parish House into fully accessible apartments and community areas for shared living is estimated at \$1.3 million dollars. All funds must be acquired before work on the building may begin. CHOM has begun work applying for significant federal

grants. Locally we must raise at least \$300,000 toward renovations. We hope that renovations can begin late this fall.

The more quickly funds are secured, the sooner work can begin.



CHOM has begun preliminary work on our site. Environmental studies, site survey

and other behind the scene work is underway.
