The building exterior will be restored, and the inside will be rearranged but have its historic features such as the beautiful wainscoting and staircases in place. This is what we have been working towards for the past four years.

- •Obtaining a construction estimate.
- •Working with the DHHS on future services for our residents.

# PLANNING BOARD APPROVES LOCAL SOLUTIONS PROJECT

On June 3<sup>rd</sup>, the Local Solutions (LS) project took a major leap forward when the Bar Harbor Planning Board granted

unanimous approval to our project. Prior to the Planning Board vote, a public hearing was held to discuss the project. This hearing was the end of a process that involved several planning board meetings, a site review visit, and approval by Bar Harbor's Design Review Board. Present were representatives of Community Housing of Maine (CHOM), our partner in this project, as well as LS Board members and community members.

Board members spoke passionately about the grassroots origin of the project, and the urgent need for housing for young adults with disabilities in a location where they can walk to community services and live independent lives while having the support they need. Tim Fleck talked about the enthusiastic response of church members for the donation of the building. Ezra Halkett, future resident of the house, talked about the loneliness of living on his own and the positive aspects of moving into the LS house. Terry Kelley of the Housing Authority talked about the importance of creating housing in the community for people with disabilities. Neighbors and community members expressed support for this worthwhile project. One person shared that Bar Harbor has many things of which to be proud, and this project is one more.

At the end of the public hearing, the Planning Board voted unanimously to approve the project. They commented about overwhelming community support for this project, and Mr. Ivan Rasmussen, Chair, shared his strong feelings about preserving historic buildings, and how gratified he was that this project will provide benefits on so many levels.
